



Making a mask from Dingbats

Find some dingbats you like. Floral sprays are good for masks. Group them together around a quick shape coloured black, make the edge of shape fuzzy, either using the edge brush or the roughen tool.



Now group them altogether. Copy the image and then using "paste special" and then "Serif transparent bitmap"



You can now click on the "convert to frame" that appears on the menu bar, and your image is now a mask. Some parts of the image may be missing if they are small, but that won't matter.

Drag a photo onto the mask and voila one lovely image.
